

Material slist.

1. Tricot/cotton interlock fabric - in your choice of skin colour. For one Star Baby allow a piece 7cm x 7cm. *Ideal head circumference* - 5cm - 7cm (depending on whether you are making the little star baby or the larger one)

2. Wool felt - choose one colour for the body (14cm x 6cm will be enough for one Star Baby body) and a second, complimentary colour for the moon bed pouch (16cm x 8 cm). If you choose to give your Star Baby a hat you will also need a small piece of felt (or upcycled wool material) for this (7cm x 7cm).

3. 100% wool stuffing - a handful per Star Baby.

4. English Leicester or Corriedale wool fibres - for the hair.

5. Cotton quilting thread/strong sewing thread - in a colour tone similar to your doll skin fabric + one in a similar colour to the hair. We will be using this to sew up the head and the other to attach the hair. I use Gutermann Quilting Cotton (see supplier list for details). Any cotton will work.

6. Embroidery cotton/floss - in colours to match/complement your wool felt colours.

7. Gold or silver or other metallic thread - to sew up the crescent moon pocket onto your moon bed.

8. Sewing needles - Quilt basting needles (these are very long thin sharp needles and my favourites for doll making).

9. Scissors, pins, chopstick for stuffing.

10. Red beeswax crayon - to give your Star Baby some rosy cheeks.

11. Optional - Glass beads or star sequins - to add a little magic to your Star Baby.

12. Optional - Woven cotton or linen fabric to line your moon bed.



About... These little Celestial Star babies make a gorgeous little keepsake that will be treasured for years to come. The perfect gift, party favour or a little decoration for the Christmas tree. A great first project that can also be made with children 7 years old & older.



Tricot is the traditional material used to make Steiner/Waldorf dolls. It is cotton interlock fabric when you look closely you will see vertical lines and when you pull side ways you will feel its stretch. This is usually sold in a tube, which means you get a double layer, which you will find is perfect for cutting out the patterns. Repurposing old t-shirts is a good alternative and dyeing with tea or coffee usually gives good skin colour tones.
