

Clucky Hen Egg Cosy

Materials List



1. Wool felt - in a main colour for your hen. You will also need some small pieces of felt for the beak, comb and wattles.

2. Embroidery cotton/floss - I like to use DMC embroidery threads. You will need thread in a colour that matches your felt to sew up your hen; in a brown to sew on some eyes; and a colour to embroider & attach the wings.

If you are wanting to do some embroidered detail like I have done for the coral/ clay coloured hen, you may like to use the beautiful hand dyed embroidery threads by [Cottage Garden Threads](#).

3. Sewing thread - in a colour that matches your hen body so that you can attach the beak, wattles & comb. I like to use either [Gutermann Quilting Cotton](#), or [Gutermann Polyester Thread](#). You can also use one-two strands of DMC embroidery thread.

4. Sewing needles - Quilt basting needles are my all time favourite needles (these are very long thin sharp needles). I also love chenille needles for general felt stitching and embroidery.

5. Scissors & pins (quilting clips are useful for the fabric insert)

6. (Optional) Fabric - just a small amount of fabric in a pattern or shade that compliments your felt to add an insert. I sewed my fabric insert together using the sewing machine, however this could easily be hand sewn using a backstitch. You will also need some thin strong thread to attach your fabric to your Clucky Hen - I like to use [Gutermann Polyester Thread](#) in a colour that matches my fabric.

About the project...

A Clucky Hen Egg Cosy to bring some magic to your breakfast table. As the weeks get colder this wool felt egg cosy is perfect to keep your children's boiled eggs warm on wintery mornings. These would also make a lovely Easter gift covering a chocolate egg or perhaps hiding a little present left by the Easter Bunny on Easter Sunday.
