

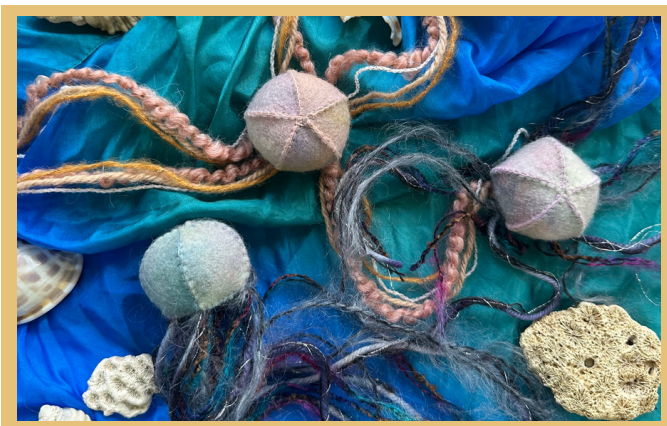
magical jellyfish for the seasonal table

Jellyfish Materials List

- 1. Wool felt** - in a colour for your jellyfish body. I used some muted shades of pink, purple and blue. Yuki loves to use brighter contrasting colours - see what resonates with you.
- 2. 100% wool stuffing** - to stuff your jellyfish.
- 3. Embroidery cotton/floss** - in a colour to match or contrast with your coloured felt.
- 4. Textured yarn/ wool** - you'll need some interesting yarns/ knitting wool to make the tentacles. Look for different fibres such as mohair or alpaca and mix the fuzzier yarns with some chunky yarns. I suggest about 3-5 pieces of yarn per tentacle (you'll need 5 tentacles) about 30-45cm depending on the length you'd like. See what you can find in your local op-shop.
- 5. Sewing needles** - Quilt basting needles are my favourites, (these are very long thin sharp needles)
- 6. Scissors, pins, chopstick for stuffing.**
